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Anti-Bullying Week

13th-17th November.


Pupils in all year groups will be participating in Anti Bullying week beginning with a whole school worship on Monday focusing on this important issue. Throughout the week pupils will explore the subject of bullying in class and as part of their PSHE lessons. The theme is 'Make a Noise about Bullying'. The definition of bullying is:

... behaviour by an individual or group, repeated over time, that intentionally hurts another individual or group either physically or emotionally

We use a pneumonic at school for the children to understand what bullying is (the definition):

STOP

(Bullying is) SUSTAINED, TARGETTED, ON, PURPOSE.







To raise awareness of diversity and inclusion (that we are all unique) in Anti-Bullying week, children and adults are invited to wear odd socks to school on Friday 17th

November to help raise awareness.

We shall also be running a 'Design a Pair of Odd Socks' competition with a prize for the best designs. Pupils will be bringing home an entry form today.

We have a zero tolerance of bullying at St Mary's and speak to the children regularly about this. We are pleased that in our most recent surveys children and parents tell us that children feel safe in school and that we take bullying seriously.

In the most recent BANES-wide SHEU survey with **children**. The first figure is our school. The second is children across BANES. It is interesting to note that we are above the BANES average for both measures.

In our most recent **parent** survey 93% of parents said that the 'school deals with bullying quickly and effectively'. 100% said that their child feels safe at our school!

Recently we had a review, by an external partner, of 'Behaviours and Attitudes' at St Mary's. Our reviewer made their judgements based on observations (during class time, playtime, worship), speaking to staff and children and conversations with the Senior Leadership team.

We were pleased to read the review this week which rated us with the best possible grade.


