Do you live less than 15 minutes from Radstock library? - If so, you may be eligible to join our club ... The Radstock Foodies Club aims to help the local community by providing a weekly pop-up style market. The club offers a range of food products including locally sourced fresh fruit and vegetables, canned goods and cupboard staples such as pasta, rice and cereal. There is also a selection of chilled, dairy goods and freezer meals. The club runs weekly on a Friday afternoon from 1.15pm-3pm out of the library/Community Hub in Radstock. Club members pay £3.50 a week for their box of food, and are able to select what they would like from a range of options available to them.
