A sculpture is an art form made in three dimensions. Sculptors use four basic processes carving, modelling, casting, constructing - to create their works

## What's the difference between a statue and a sculpture?

There are countless statues around the world: from the tall mo'ai statues of Easter Island to the surreal figure of The Little Mermaid in Copenhagen. A statue is a type of sculpture: free-standing and made in the image of a figure. They can be a deity, a person, an animal or a mythical being. They are either life-size or larger.
