

Key Vocabulary

Papyrus	A material like paper used by The Ancient Egyptians to write on.
Press Printing	These prints are produced through the image being drawn on to the materials, which is usually a softer type of material, which allows for freedom of movement.
Hieroglyphics	A writing system used by the Ancient Egyptians that uses pictures and symbols instead of letters and words.
Replica	A thing made to closely resemble another.
Screen printing	To mark with intersecting line or pass back and forth through or over.
Direct printing	Ink is spread over a surface, then an image is etched onto the ink, a piece of paper is placed directly on the surface to develop the print.
Indirect printing	The paper is put straight onto the ink, and the image is then drawn on top.
Collograph	Printing technique used with textures, layers of card, string or a glue gun.

Canopic Jars - used to hold mummified remains, such as organs.



Hieroglyphics - a writing system consisting of letters and symbols.
