General Knowledge

Sculpture is using different materials to create 3D structures which can be created using different types of materials such as:

- cardboard
- plastic
- concrete
- food
- ice
- wood
- clay

Fixing your sculpture together: To fix or join a sculpture together a material will need to be used, such as tape, glue, elastic bands or mod rock.

Sculptors use line, shape, form and space when creating their work.

- Lines create outlines, and they can be different lengths or widths.
- Lines which meet up create shapes.
- Form creates depth and 3D shapes.
- Space lies around, in or between an object

Famous Figure

Barbara Hepworth- 1903-1975

Instead of making art that looked like people or things, Hepworth began to make sculptures and drawings using abstract shapes. She was inspired by nature and the world around her. She remembered driving through the countryside with her family, and the shapes, bumps and ridges of the roads, hills and fields. She wanted to capture how it felt to be in both the ancient landscape and in the modern world.

Many of Barbara's abstract sculptures are made from stone, wood and bronze. Some are very large and are exhibited outside which reflects her love of nature.
