

Key Vocabulary:

The Ten Commandments	Laws or rules handed down to Moses by God on Mount Sinai.
Covenant	An agreement between God and his people.
The book of Exodus	The second book of the Old Testament; it tells of the departure of the Israelites out of slavery in Egypt led by Moses; God gave them the Ten Commandments and the rest of Mosaic law on Mount Sinai during the Exodus.
Freedom	The power or right to act, speak, or think as one wants.
Justice	The upholding of what is fair, just and right.
Society	People living together in a more or less ordered community
Vulnerability	Being susceptible to physical or emotional injury or attack.
Obedience	Behaviour that's respectful and mindful of rules and laws.

Ten Commandments:

2. You shall not make for yourself any idol, nor bow down to it or worship it.
3. You shall not misuse the name of the Lord your God.
4. You shall remember and keep the Sabbath day holy.
5. Respect your father and mother.
6. You must not commit murder.
7. You must not commit adultery.
8. You must not steal.
9. You must not give false evidence against your neighbour.
10. You must not be envious of your neighbour's goods.
