How are we half way through the academic year!? This term will be full of many different learning opportunities. Class 4 will be finding out the melting points of chocolate in science which is something to look forward to... as well as our amazing trip to the Bristol Museum that is coming up this Term! I can't wait to see what Term 4 will bring!

What we are learning

This term our **topic** is '**Ancient Egyptian's!**' As part of our topic we will be exploring Ancient Egyptian artefacts and learning about the process of mummification. We will also be visiting Bristol museum and taking part in an Egyptian workshop, getting hands on with some real and replica artefacts!

In **English**, we will be writing Egyptian myths, instructions *and* portal stories. We will draw inspiration from the twists and turns of life as an Egyptian to write suspenseful narratives.

In **Maths**, we will be continuing our learning on Multiplication and Division, before moving onto length and perimeter and then focussing on decimals and fractions. And of course practicing our times tables!

In **Science** the children will continue learning about States of Matter, they will be sorting materials into solids, liquids and gases; they will investigate how heating causes melting and cooling causes freezing. Children will be predicting, making observations and drawing graphs.

In **RE**, we will be exploring the key question 'Is forgiveness always possible for Christians?'

In **History**, we will be exploring the Ancient Egyptians by looking at artefacts. The children will also have the chance to explain and perform the ancient ritual of mummification and will look at a timeline into history.

In **PSHE**, we will be looking at how to stay Healthy, from looking at a healthy balanced diet to how smoking and drinking can have an impact on our health. We will also be looking at how to be a good friend and to enjoy healthy relationships.

In **Music**, we will be focusing on composing with your friends. Children will understand rhythm and work collaboratively to produce a final piece of work, using the song 'lean on me' to guide us.

In **Art**, we will be exploring different types of printing using string, glue, polystyrene and cardboard; children will also explore the artist William Morris and making links to printing in Ancient Egypt.

In **Computing**, the focus is on, Effective searching and Hardware Investigators.

In **French**, we will be learning how to say our name, age and where they live in French.

Useful information:

Reading is the skill that allows children to access other areas of the curriculum. The children complete guided reading sessions at school to develop their comprehension of texts. However, it is really important that you continue to read at home with your child and complete their reading record every day. It is great if you are able to listen to your child read aloud, even for just a few minutes a day. We have a reading reward system, so that children are recognised for their efforts in reading at home.

Weekly Multiplication Quiz

As we progress through year 4, we need to be super speedy with our multiplications. To ensure this we will have weekly multiplication and division quizzes to ensure children are making progress and sustaining their knowledge of times tables. Again, regular revision at home will really benefit the children.
