SATS Week

The Standardised Assessment Tests (SATS) for Year 6 will take place 13-16th May. For the four days, there is a short assessment of between 40 mins and an hour each day. The rest of the day is spent carrying out some interactive revision activities, outside PE time and other curriculum learning.

SATs are a snapshot of what children have learnt throughout their time in primary school. Each and every child has made fantastic progress this academic year. We are proud of the hard work and resilience they have shown in preparing for the tests. They are definitely ready to 'show what they know'.

We wish all of our fantastic Year 6 children well for SATS week, and know that they are looking forward to their SATS breakfast each morning.

Those who wish to enter are invited to create a piece of artwork on a paper plate on the theme of food – further details and instructions on how to enter are displayed on the flyer opposite............



Attendance


