Sharing is a key part of Sikh beliefs and practice

Festivals:

- Vaisakhi – this remembers the beginning of the Khalsa (refer back to first lesson)
- Diwali – a festival commemorating the story of Guru Gobind Singh – a story of sharing and humanitarianism. Diwali can be celebrated in different ways in different parts of the world – lights are often part of the festivities

- The Place of Worship, **The Gurdwara**, is a focus of the festival celebrations – the community are involved fully
- Celebrations include – singing, music, reading from the holy book, hymn chanting and community care
