<b>Vocabulary</b>	
<b>creation</b>	the act of creating or of causing something to exist
<b>sabbath</b>	Saturday, the day of rest and worship for Jews and some Christians
<b>commandment</b>	an order or law
<b>Shabbat</b>	Jewish day of rest that begins at sunset on Friday and lasts til nightfall on Sunday
<b>Torah</b>	is a holy Jewish text, handwritten on rolled up sheets of animal skin
<b>Challah bread</b>	is a special Jewish bread
<b>Shabbat candles</b>	Candles are lit on or near the table where the Shabbat dinner will be served
<b>Kiddush prayer</b>	Is a special prayer recited before drinking wine – it is a central part of important Jewish events
<b>Kiddush cup</b>	Is a special goblet or glass used in Jewish ceremonies where a blessing is recited
<b>Kippah</b>	Is a small head covering traditionally worn by Jewish men or boys as a sign of respect to God
<b>Havdalah cup</b>	Is filled with grape juice and used in the Havdalah ritual to mark the end of Shabbat
